I. General information

1.1 Survey subjects

Master's students who graduated from the Faculty of Information Systems at the University of Information Technology, VNU-HCM

1.2. **Survey form:** Questionnaire (paper-based survey). The Department of Inspection – Legislation- Quality Assurance coordinated with the Department of Graduate Studies – Science- Technology to distribute and collect survey sheets for Master's students during the graduation ceremony.

1.3. Contents

The content of the survey comprises three parts: Objectives and curriculum; teaching staff; management and training services; overall assessment of the entire course. The questionnaire consists of 21 questions/criteria with a 5-level Likert scale. The collected results will be processed using Excel.

II. Survey results

This is the first graduating class of Master's students from the Faculty of Information Systems. Due to the small number of Master's graduates, the sample size is insufficient for reliable tests and correlation analysis, as per the formula for calculating small sample sizes ($n = \frac{N}{1 + N \cdot (e)^2}$). Therefore, the report will present the results obtained from the survey for reference purposes.
