

**SUMMARY REPORT:**  
**Survey of Students’ Feedback on a Lecturer’ Activities  
for Academic Year 2016/2017, Semester 2**

**1. Introduction**

- The survey was helpful in the continuous quest for improvements in teaching and thereby enhancing the students' learning experience in the University of Information Technology (UIT). The information may be used as one means of demonstrating teaching effectiveness for decisions regarding merit, renewal, tenure and promotion
- The survey was conducted from May 29, 2017 to June 30, 2017 (at the end of the semester and before the publication of grades) by the Office of Inspection-Legal Affairs-Quality Assurance.
- The survey respondents were the full-time students learning theoretical, hands-on (type 1) and hands-on (type 2) subjects at UIT.
- Students completed the online questionnaire at <http://survey.uit.edu.vn>.
- The questionnaire used four-point Likert scales with responses ranging: 1- Not good/ Not satisfied, 2- Average, 3- Good/ Satisfied, 4- Very good/ Very satisfied, and No comment. In addition, there are additional comments.
